

A spouse may obtain a divorce in Mississippi by proving the defendant is “naturally impotent”. Few cases in Mississippi discuss this ground for divorce. However, cases from other jurisdictions suggest that impotency is an incurable ability to engage in sexual relations (possibly due to a physical condition or even a sexually transmitted disease), not the inability to procreate.
